

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Staff and parents of Canberra High School want students to be safe at school and on school activities. Schools, including Canberra High School, have chosen to have a uniform that is economical and appropriate. It is well known that competition for clothes of the latest fashion is reduced when a uniform is worn daily. Evidence from teachers, parents and students at this school supports the notion that students are provided with a higher level of protection because they are in uniform when on the playground. The School Board approved the following updated Uniform Policy in 2016.

The Policy requires all students to wear:

- A Canberra High School top. These are black or white polo shirts (which have collars and sleeves), with 'Canberra High School' printed/embroidered on them.
- Black pants, skirts or shorts which meet sun-smart requirements. Dark denim jeans are still
 permissible as long as they are in a suitable condition.

We adhere to the ACT Department of Education and Training's **Sun Smart Policy** and **OHS regulations**. All clothes must cover the shoulders, neck and upper thigh. Tops must be collared and must be able to be tucked in at the waist. All clothes must be clean, neat and in good repair and suitable for school.

In cooler weather, students wear a Canberra High School jumper/jersey over their polo top. These are plain black jumpers/jerseys with 'Canberra High School' printed/embroidered on them and/or a black spray jacket with 'Canberra High School' printed/embroidered on them. (If for temperature reasons there is a need for another layer of clothing, the article must be plain black or white and worn under the polo shirt.)

The Health and Physical Education (SHAPE) and other sporting activities official uniform shirt is coloured and collard depending on which sport house students belong to; **Denman (red) Gowrie (green) Fisher (blue) and Lyons (yellow)**. Students are required to change into suitable black bottoms for SHAPE. Jeans are not acceptable. All uniforms can be purchased at Lowes Belconnen Mall.

Footwear must cover the feet and provide safety in practical areas, in the playground and inside the school. Thongs, open sandals and open back shoes are not part of the school uniform.

Jewellery and **hairstyles** must also meet safety requirements.

Hats and caps that meet the sun-smart provisions should be worn when students are outside.

Staff expect all CHS students to wear the uniform in an appropriate manner.

Please Note:

Accessories such as oversized belts, bands, chains, beads and the like are not part of the CHS
uniform and should not be worn to school.

CHS uniform items should be comfortable and meet safety requirements.
